Heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

This is an application for bail in connection with Special Case No. 10 of 2017/Birpur P.S.Case No.74 of 2017 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 27(b)(ii) of Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940, 27 of NDPS Act and 25(1 b) a and 26 of the Arms Act.

Allegation against the petitioner is that on his confessional statement, cough syrup has been recovered from the shop of the petitioner and further allegation is that nine live cartridges have been recovered from the hotel of one Binod Sah. It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner that he has clean antecedent and he has remained in custody since 2.4.2017.

Heard learned APP also.



Having heard both sides and considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances, let the petitioner, named above, be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.25,000/-(Rupees twenty five thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Sessions Judge, Supaul, in connection with Special Case No. 10 of 2017/Birpur P.S.Case No.74 of 2017, subject to the conditions that:-

- (i) One of the bailors of the petitioner shall be a local person having sufficient immovable properties within the jurisdiction of the concerned Court.
- (ii) The petitioner will not induce any witness or tamper with the evidence.
- (iii) The petitioner shall cooperate in the disposal of trial and make himself available as and when required by the court and on the event of failure on his part to appear before the court below on two consecutive dates without showing any genuine reason, the prosecution is free to move for cancellation of his bail.
