The State-petitioners have filed this review petition seeking for review of the order d ated 12.03.2015 passed in W.P.(C). No.7021 of 2004, which has been disposed of directing the S tate-petitioners to consider the case of opposite parties giving appointment in any Class-III or Class-IV posts within a period of six months.

Along with the review application, Misc. Case No.63 of 2017 has been filed under Section 5 of Limitation Act for condonation of delay of 714 days in preferring the review application

Heard Mr. A.K. Mishra, learned Additional Government Advocate for the State-petitioners and Mr. S. Mohanty, learned counsel for opposite parties no.1 to 4.

Mr. A.K. Mishra, learned Additional Government Advocate for the State-petitioners state s that the reasons for delay have been explained in the limitation petition itself.

Mr. S. Mohanty, learned counsel for opposite parties no.1 to 4 states that the reasons for delay in filing the review petition which have been explained in the limitation petition is nothing but bureaucratic movement of file. Therefore, delay may not be condoned.

Considering the contentions raised by learned counsel for the parties and after going t hrough the records, it appears that sufficient cause has not been shown for condonation of del ay of 714 days in filing the review petition. In State of Odisha and another v. Smt.Bishnupriy a Routray and another, 2014 (II) ILR 938, this Court considered similar question of condonation of delay in filing the application. Considering the same applying to the present context, th is Court is not inclined to condone the delay of 714 days in filing the review petition.

In that view of the matter, the misc. case filed for condonation of delay is dismissed. Accordingly, the review petition is also dismissed.
