(SMT. JYOTI AGRAWAL Vs THE STATE OF MADHYA PRADESH)

This is first application for grant of anticipatory bail under section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure filed on behalf of applicant-Smt. Jyoti Agrawal.

The applicant is apprehending arrest in connection with Crime No.23/2017, registered at Police Station Lidhora, District Tikamgarh, for the offences under sections 419, 420, 464, 465, 467, 469 and 471 of the Indian Penal Code.

Allegedly, applicant has identified the main accused Manvendra Singh as Rampal Yadav and replacing the photographs of Manavendra Singh in the I.D. of Rampal Yadav thereby helped the accused Manvendra Singh to obtain loan from the Bank impersonating himself to be Rampal Yadav.

On behalf of the applicant it is submitted that an unregistered complaint case was filed by Rampal Yadav. After the applicant deposed before the learned Judicial Magistrate First Class, crime has been registered against her by order of the Court.

On behalf of the respondent/State, Shri R.K. Kesharwani, learned Panel Lawyer has vehemently opposed the application.

Keeping in view the submissions made by the learned counsel for the parties and the fact that applicant is a woman and is working as computer operator, without expressing any view on the merits of the

case, I am of the view that this is a fit case for grant of anticipatory bail to the applicant. Consequently, her application under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure is hereby allowed.

It is directed that in the event of her arrest, applicant-**Smt. Jyoti Agrawal** shall be released on bail on her furnishing a personal bond in the sum of Rs.30,000/- (Rupees Thirty Thousand) with a solvent surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer.

The applicant shall make herself available for interrogation before the Investigating Officer as and when required. She shall further abide by the other conditions enumerated in sub-section (2) of Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
