ORDER

None appeared for the petitioner on call though names of 2 counsels are reflected in the cause list for the petitioner.

It is seen that even on last occasion i.e., on 14.08.2017 when the matter was called, the petitioner remained unrepresented.

Ms. D. Das Barman, learned Government Advocate appearing for the State respondent Nos. 1 to 5 placed a communication dated 25.09.2017 of the Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime), Guwahati clarifying that the petitioner on 01.04.2014 submitted an application before the Odlabakra Police Out Post stating that one Rajak Khan entered into his house compound and assaulted him due to non-payment of loan amount of Rs.30,000/-.

During inquiry of the case the authority found that the petitioner took an amount of Rs.30,000/- on interest from said Rajak Khan of Paltanbazar area and he submitted before the Inquiry Officer that he had settled the matter amicably with said Rajak Khan and as such no case was registered on the basis of his complaint dated 01.04.2014.

However, this writ petition stands dismissed for non-prosecution.
