Grievance of the petitioner in nutshell is that some landed property, the description of which is given in the writ petition, has been transferred to his name for which he has executed the requisite documents but the respondents are not attesting the mutation of the land in question in the name of the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that petitioner would feel satisfied, if the respondents are directed to attest the mutation of the landed property in question in the name of the petitioner. Mr. Shah, learned AAG states that he has no objection in case the respondents are directed to consider the claim of the petitioner under rules.
- **3.** In view of the case setup and the stand taken by learned counsel for the parties, this writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondent/authority to accord consideration to the claim of the petitioner, of course in accordance with the rules and law on the subject within a period of two months from the date of receipt of this order along with complete paper book. **Disposed of.**
