Since common questions of law and facts arise for consideration in these appeals, the same were taken up together for hearing and are being disposed of by a common judgment.

2 It is conceded by all the parties that the findings recorded by the learned trial court as also by the learned first appellate court are self-contradictory and confusing and therefore, they have jointly prayed that the matter be remanded to the learned trial court for decision afresh on the basis of the pleadings and material that is already available on record. The prayer is accepted.

3 Accordingly, both the appeals are allowed by setting aside the impugned judgments and decrees passed by both the learned courts below with a direction to the learned trial court to decide the civil suit(s) afresh on the basis of pleadings and material that is already available on record. Further, the learned trial court is directed to deal with each of the issues separately in each of the civil suit by delinking both the civil suits. I am conscious that the evidence has been recorded only in one of the civil suit, therefore, it is

clarified that the said evidence shall be read in evidence and shall form part of the record of another civil suit.

4 The parties through their respective counsel to appear before the learned trial court on **5.12.2018**.
