- 2, 8, 56, 72 and 145 correctly but due to anomaly in the answer key in Hindi vis-a-vis English medium, her answers have not been correctly evaluated, depriving her the due marks.
- 2. It goes without saying that such like issues are to be examined by an Expert Committee which may have been constituted by the Board to consider the representations, if any, received from the candidates against the answer key.
- 3. The petitioner is stated to have already represented the Board. In any case, we grant one more opportunity to the petitioner to represent to the Board alongwith supporting material with reference to questions No. 2, 8, 56, 72 and 145 and let such representation be placed before the Expert Committee for an appropriate decision. The Expert Committee will take its decision within a period of one month from the date of receipt of such representation.

4. The writ petition is disposed of accordingly.

Pending miscellaneous applications, if any, also stand disposed of.
