This bail application has been filed under Section 438 CrPc.

Counsel for the petitioners submit that the matter pertains to a civil nature dispute between the family members. No case is made out against the petitioners, hence they be released on bail.

Learned PP appearing for the State as well as counsel for the complainant have vehemently opposed the bail application.

Taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case, without commenting further on the merits and demerits of the case, I deem it just and proper to grant benefit of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Therefore, this bail application filed under Section 438 CrPC is allowed and it is directed that in the event of arrest of petitioners (1) Smt. Suman W/o Rahul Siyag and (2) Rahul Siyag S/o Shri Jaidev Singh, in connection with FIR No. 63/2018 registered at Police Station, Vidhyadhar Nagar, Jaipur, they shall be released on bail by the concerned SHO/Investigating Officer, provided each of them furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs. 20,000/- (Rs. Twenty Thousand), with two sureties of like amount to his / her satisfaction on the following conditions:

- i) That the petitioners shall make themselves available for interrogation by a police officer, as and when required;
- ii) That the petitioners shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case, so as to dissuade him/her from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer;
- iii) That the petitioners shall not leave without previous permission of the court;
- iv) That the petitioners shall not commit any offence similar to the offence of which they are accused or suspected.
