**HON'BLE MR. JUSTICE VEERENDR SINGH SIRADHANA**

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the controversy raised in the instant writ application stands resolved in view of the adjudication by a Coordinate Bench of this Court in SBCWP No. 11807/2014; Bal Kishan Vs. State (Panchayati Raj Dept.) & Anr., decided on 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2017, after affording an opportunity of hearing to the State-respondents.

It is further urged that for the present, the petitioner would be satisfied, if the State-respondents are directed to consider and decide the representation within a time frame in the backdrop of the case in SBCWP No. 11807/2014.

In view of the limited prayer addressed; the instant writ

proceedings are closed with a direction to the petitioner to address a comprehensive representation to the respondents within two weeks hereinafter.

In case, a representation is so addressed within the aforesaid period, the State-respondents are directed to consider and decide the same by a reasoned and speaking order as expeditiously as possible in accordance with law; preferably, within ten weeks from the date of receipt of the representation along with a certified copy of this order.

With the observations and directions, as indicated above, the writ application stands disposed off.
