- O1. Challenge in the present appeal is to the order passed by the learned Single Judge whereby the writ petition filed by the appellant challenging the order passed by the J&K Consumers Protection Commission, Jammu, was dismissed.
- O2. The dispute pertains to the claim of damages on account of an alleged defective Dental Chair supplied to predecessor-in-interest of respondent Nos.3&4 by the Company known as M/s Eagle Dent Equipments Private Limited, Ahmedabad.
- 03. The complaint filed by predecessor-in-interest of respondent Nos.3&4 was allowed and sum of ₹ 1,03,500/- along with interest at the rate of 9% per annum from 09.07.1995 onwards, ₹ 10,000/- as compensation and ₹ 3,000/- as litigation charges, were directed to be paid.

04. On 22.02.2019, learned counsel for the appellant sought time to

explore the possibility of amicable resolution of the dispute.

O5. Today, he has submitted that the appellant has given instruction

to him to state before the Court that the dispute can be resolved. The

appellant is ready and willing to pay a sum of ₹ 1,03,500/- as full and final

settlement of claim of the predecessor-in-interest of respondent Nos.3 and 4.

06. Learned counsel appearing for respondent Nos. 3&4 submitted

that the offer made by the appellant is acceptable. In case the aforesaid

stated amount is paid, the claim made by predecessor-in-interest of

respondent Nos.3&4 shall stand settled finally.

O7. After hearing learned counsel for the parties, the present appeal

is disposed of in view of the settlement of dispute between the parties. Let

the appellant pay a sum of ₹ 1,03,500/- to respondent No.3, as stated by

learned counsel for respondent Nos.3&4, by way of a bank draft within a

period of four weeks.

08. On the encashment thereof, the dispute as raised in the present

litigation shall stand settled finally.

09. The appeal is disposed of accordingly.
