The writ petitioners claim to be the aged parents of the private respondent No. 6. The private respondent no. 5 is the son-in-law of the writ petitioners.

Learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that both the petitioners are suffering from various ailments and are having to deal with the unlawful acts of the private respondents who are forcing the writ petitioners to hand over the dwelling house where the petitioners are presently residing. The prayer of the writ petitioners is for a direction on the respondent police authorities to registrar the FIR filed in the Uttarpara Police Station by way of a General Diary dated 14th August, 2020. Counsel places a letter written to the Officer-in-Charge of the Uttarpara Police Station on 12th August, 2020 outlining the grievance of the writ petitioners.

Learned counsel appearing for the State/Police authorities submits that an investigation into the alleged offence has already been undertaken and completed.

Report of the result of the investigation has also been filed before the learned Court of the ACJM, Srirampur, in October, 2020.

Upon hearing learned counsel for the parties, this Court is of the view that since an investigation has already been undertaken into the matter and a Report filed recently pursuant to such investigation, no further order need to be passed in the writ petition.

WPA 7773 of 2020 is disposed of in terms of the above.
