Heard learned counsel for the parties.

Petitioner seeks restoration of W.P.(S) No. 3693 of 2017, which was dismissed for non-compliance of the preemptory order dated 26th September, 2018 on failure to remove the surviving defects.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the writ petition relates to claim of post retirement dues of the petitioner. However, defect could not be removed within preemptory time due to inadvertence. Petitioner is not at fault. He would suffer irreparably if the writ petition is not restored.

Learned counsel for CCL and CMPF have not opposed the prayer.

Having considered the explanation furnished and the submission of the parties, let W.P.(S) No. 3693 of 2017 be restored to its original file.

Surviving defects, if any, in the writ petition be removed within a period of 2 weeks.

Accordingly, C.M.P. stands disposed of.
