2. 31.07.2020

This matter is taken up through Video Conferencing. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

This Contempt Petition has been filed alleging that the direction of this Court issued in W.P.(C) No.1166 of 2020 on 22.01.2020 has not been worked out as of now.

Considering the submissions made, this Court observes, instead of issuing notice, it would be appropriate to give one more opportunity to the opposite party-authority to comply with the direction of this Court issued in W.P.(C) No.1166 of 2020. In the process, while disposing of this Contempt Petition, this Court directs the opposite party-authority to work out the direction issued in W.P.(C) No.1166 of 2020 on 22.01.2020 by taking all effective steps within a period of one & half months from the date of communication of a copy of this order by the petitioner, if there is no legal impediment inasmuch as stay order operating involving the order passed in W.P.(C) No.1166 of 2020. Failure in compliance of this Court's direction will be construed to be deliberate violation of the Court's order.

Petitioner has the responsibility to serve copy of this order on the opposite party- authority within a period of seven days, as undertaken.

As Lock-down period is continuing for COVID-19, learned counsel for the petitioner may utilize the soft copy of this order available in the High Court's website or print out thereof at par with certified copies in the manner prescribed, vide Court's Notice No.4587, dated 25.03.2020.
