This petition has been filed by the petitioner under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking direction to the respondents for granting benefit of senior pay scale of Rs.15,600-37,100 and pay fixation on selection grade of Rs.6600/- and also grant of 3rd *Kramonnati* Pay Scale after completing of 30 years of his service as per the circulars issued by the respondents dated 11.08.2020 and 29.06.2018.

3. It is submitted that although representations dated 05.11.2020, 04.12.2020 and 04.01.2021 (**Annexure P/10 to P/12**) have been filed by the petitioner seeking the aforementioned benefits, however, no order has been passed on it. It is further submitted that the respondents be directed to decide the petitioner's representation and the petitioner may be extended the aforementioned benefits in the light of the circulars dated 11.08.2020 and 29.06.2018.

4. Counsel for the State, on the other hand, has submitted that the representation of the petitioner shall be decided in accordance with

law.

5. Having considered rival submissions, the petition is disposed of with a direction to the petitioner to file a fresh representation along with all relevant documents before the competent authority/respondents within a period of two weeks from today and if such a representation is filed by the petitioner, the same shall be decided by the competent authority/respondents in light of the circulars dated 11.08.2020 and 29.06.2018 by a speaking and reasoned order, in accordance with law within a further period of four months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

6. It is made clear that this Court has not reflected upon the merits of the case.

7. With the aforesaid, present petition stands disposed of.
