Sah, learned Deputy Advocate General for the State.</p> <p>This writ petition is filed seeking for a writ of certiorari to quash the FIR lodged against the petitioners, details whereof are given in the prayer clause.</p> <p>The writ petition is being disposed of at the admission stage itself with the consent of learned counsel for the parties.</p> <p>In view of the judgment rendered by Hon'ble Apex Court in Arnesh Kumar vs. State of Bihar and another, reported in (2014) 8 SCC 273, the petitioner should be arrested only when the Investigating Officer has reason to believe on the basis of information and material collected, that he has committed an offence. Before making arrest, the Investigating Officer is required to satisfy himself that the arrest is necessary for one or more purposes envisaged by Sub-Clauses (a) to (e) of Clause (1) of Section 41 of Cr.P.C. It will not be based upon the <i>ipsi dixit</i> of the Police Officer. In other words, the petitioner shall be arrested only when the conditions stipulated in Sub-Clauses (a) to (e) of Clause (1) of Section 41 of Cr.P.C. are satisfied.</p>
