Learned State Counsel raised formal objection stating that offences punishable under Sections 467, 468 and 471 IPC are non-compoundable offences.

Ιn view of the above and considering the principle of law laid down by Hon'ble Apex Court in Nikhil Merchant v. C.B.I. & Ors, (2008) 9 SCC 677; B.S. Joshi v. State Haryana & Anr reported in (2003) 4 SCC 675, and in Gian Singh v. State of Punjab & Another, (2012) SCC 303, the compounding application allowed. Compromise arrived between the parties is accepted.

Consequently, the entire proceedings against the applicant in Criminal Case No. 606 of 2020 (FIR No. 142 of 2019), under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B IPC, pending in the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate Pithoragarh, District Pithoragarh, are hereby quashed *qua* applicant.

Present C-482 Petition is accordingly disposed of.
