Complainant-Sunita Manglani present in person who has been identified by his counsel Mr. Atul Saxena.

This criminal miscellaneous petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing the criminal proceedings in Criminal Case No.208/2020 pending before Additional Civil Judge and Metropolitan Magistrate No.9, Jaipur Metropolitan-II in relation to FIR No.503/2019 registered at Police Station Vidhyadhar Nagar, Jaipur City (North) for the offence under Sections 354, 354-A and 354-D of IPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned counsel for the respondent submitted that compromise has been arrived between the parties and they have settled their dispute. So, criminal proceedings pending between them, be set aside.

Learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the arguments advanced by learned counsel for the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the complainant acknowledging the factum of compromise between the parties and submitted that he has no objection if the FIR in question and consequential criminal proceeding are quashed.

Heard learned counsel for both the parties and perused the record.

A perusal of the material on record shows that the dispute between the parties has amicably been settled by them. In view of compromise and the law laid down by the Hon'ble Apex Court of India in cases of **Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab (2012) 10 SCC 303** and **Narinder Singh Vs. State of Punjab (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court deems it just and proper to quash the FIR in question and consequential criminal proceeding.

Resultantly, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed. The criminal proceedings in Criminal Case No.208/2020 pending before Additional Civil Judge and Metropolitan Magistrate No.9, Jaipur Metropolitan-II in relation to FIR No.503/2019 registered at Police Station Vidhyadhar Nagar, Jaipur City (North) for the offence under Sections 354, 354-A and 354-D of IPC. are quashed.
