This bail application has been filed on behalf of the applicant- Md. Nasir Alam @ Nasir Alam with prayer to release on bail in connection with Tandwa P.S. Case No. 36 of 2021, registered under Sections 406/420/34 of the Indian Penal Code, pending in the court of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Chatra.

Learned counsel for the applicant has submitted that the F.I.R. of this case was lodged against two named accused including the applicant with these allegations that the informant was the registered owner of the Truck. The informant entered into the agreement with the named accused in which it was agreed that the accused persons would ply the vehicle on payment of installment. Initially amount of Rs.2,00,000/- was paid to the informant but rest of the amount was not paid as per agreement.

Learned Counsel for the applicant has submitted that the said Truck which was being plied by the applicant was seized by the police. Applicant and co-accused were not the registered owner of the same and said Truck was also handed over to the informant. The applicant has been languishing in Jail since 02.05.2022 and similarly situated co-accused Md. Mojahid @ Mojahid Kuraishi @ Chhotu has been granted bail in B.A.No. 12100 of 2021 vide order dated 29.11.2021 by the Co-ordinate Bench of this Court.

Learned A.P.P. appearing on behalf of the State vehemently opposed the contentions made by the learned counsel for the applicant.

In view of the submissions made and materials on record, the bail application of the applicant is hereby allowed. Let the applicant be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.20,000/- (Rupees Twenty Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the court concerned in aforesaid case.
