HON'BLE Dr. JUSTICE K. MANMADHA RAO CRIMINAL PETITION No.3816 OF 2022

ORDER:-

This criminal petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 is filed to enlarge the petitioner on bail in the event of his arrest in connection with Crime No.84 of 2019 of Chakrayapeta Police Station, Kadapa District, Andhra Pradesh registered for the offences punishable under Sections 403, 409, 420, 466, 468 and 471 read with 34 of IPC.

- 2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Additional Public Prosecutor for the State.
- 3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and therefore, his case may be considered for grant of bail in the event of his arrest in connection with Crime No. 84 of 2019 of Chakrayapeta Police Station, Kadapa District.
- 4. Learned Additional Public Prosecutor opposed the Criminal Petition and submits that the investigation in this case is pending. So, he would submit that the petitioner is not entitled to anticipatory bail.
- 5. In view of the submissions made by the learned counsel for the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant the relief to the petitioner, on some conditions.
- 6. Accordingly, the Criminal Petition is disposed of with a direction to the petitioner to surrender before the Station House Officer, Chakrayapeta Police Station, Kadapa District, within 15 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

On such surrender, the petitioner shall be released on bail on

his executing personal bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees

Twenty Five Thousand only) with two sureties for a likesum

each to the satisfaction of the said Station House Officer. On

his release, he shall appear before the said Police Station, once

in a week i.e., on every Saturday between 10:00 AM and 05:00

PM, till filing of charge sheet. Further, on such release, the

petitioner shall abide by the conditions mentioned under

Section 438(2) of Cr.P.C as under;

1) The petitioner shall make himself available for

interrogation by a police officer as and when required.

2) The petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any

inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with

the facts and circumstances of the case so as to dissuade him

from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer.
