The Writ Petition is filed under Article 226 of Constitution of India, seeking to direct the respondents to consider the representation of the petitioner dated 16.04.2022 for conversion from Khata No.20001901 to Khata No.9998 in the web land portal in respect of the subject matter property pursuant to the recommendation of the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent dated 19.04.2022.
- 3. During the course of hearing, the learned counsel for the petitioner referring to communication addressed by the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent to the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent dated 19.04.2022 wherein, the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent has requested the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent to recommend

to enable an extent of Ac.0.59 cents in Survey No.231 and an

extent of Ac.1.17 cents in Survey No.232 of Illuru Village of

Yerraguntla Mandal for conversion from Khata No.20001901 to

Khata No.9998 in web land portal for mutation in favour of

applicant/writ petitioner submits that so far the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent

has not passed any orders on the same, which is unjust and

arbitrary. He submits that the petitioner under the said

circumstances, is constrained to approach this Court.

4. Considering the submissions of the learned counsel for the

petitioner and on perusal of the report submitted by the 4<sup>th</sup>

respondent, this Court deems it appropriate to dispose of Writ

Petition with a direction to the 2<sup>nd</sup> respondent to take action on

the application of the petitioner for conversion of Khata by taking

into consideration the 4<sup>th</sup> respondent communication, dated

19.04.2022 and pass appropriate orders, within a period of four

(4) weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

5. With the above direction, the Writ Petition is disposed of.

There shall be no order as to costs.

As a sequel, pending miscellaneous petitions, if any, shall

stand closed.
