Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Assistant Government Pleader for Revenue. With their consent, the writ petition is disposed of.

- 2. The writ petition is filed seeking the following relief:
- "... declaring the inaction of respondent No.3 in not cancelling the Document No.1647/2018 in accordance with Section 23 of Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 and passing orders for maintenance by making unwarranted and unscrupulous remarks against the son-in-law of the petitioner as illegal arbitrary and violation of principles of natural justice and against Article 14, 21 and 300-A of Constitution of India and consequently to set aside the order passed by respondent No.3 dated 16.4.2022"
- 3. Though the learned counsel for the petitioner sought to advance arguments with reference to the merits of the case, it

appears that against the orders passed by the respondent No.3

dated 16.4.2022 an appeal has been preferred before the

respondent No.2 on 01.8.2022 and the same is pending

consideration. Therefore, this Court, without going into merits

of the case, deems it appropriate to dispose of the matter, with

a direction to the respondent No.2 to dispose of the appeal

filed by the petitioner subject to maintainability etc., after

giving due opportunity to all the parties, in accordance with

law, as expeditiously as possible, at any rate, within a period

of six weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

4. With the above direction, the writ petition is disposed of.

No order as to costs. As a sequel, miscellaneous petitions

pending, if any, shall stand closed.
