# HON'BLE SMT, JUSTICE LALITHA KANNEGANTI WRIT PETITION No.37647 of 2022

# ORDER:

This writ petition is filed seeking the following relief:

"...to issue a Writ, Order or Direction particularly one in the nature of Writ of Mandamus declaring the inaction of the respondent No.3 in taking steps to transfer the investigation of the Crime in FIR No.53/2022 from the respondent No.4 to any other agency as arbitrary, illegal and violative of Articles 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India and consequently direct the respondent No.3 to transfer the investigation of the crime in FIR No.53 of 2022 from the respondent No.4 to any other agency..."

- 2. Sri B.Bal Reddy, learned counsel for the petitioners, submits that the 1<sup>st</sup> petitioner has given a complaint to the police as his wife is missing and the same is registered as Crime No.53 of 2022 on 07.03.2022. Thereafter, the respondent police failed to conduct investigation and whereabouts of his wife are not known. Then, the 1<sup>st</sup> petitioner has given a complaint to the Superintendent of Police to transfer the case to CBI or CBCID Departments for further investigation.
- Sri A.Manoj Kumar, learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home, on written instructions, submits that after receiving the complaint, the respondent police issued look-out notices to all the District Police Stations including the States of Maharashtra,

Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh about the missing woman. As part of investigation, CCTV footages were also collected and thoroughly verified and also called Call Details Report and Tower Dump Tata, but no clut's are forthcoming about the missing woman. Further, as part of investigation, the respondent police enquired in all the Orphanaga's in Hyderabad limits, but no information was obtained and also scarched the unknown female dead bodies list including the States of I Jaharashtra, Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh. He further submits that the investigation is underway and the respondent police are making heetic efforts to know about the said missing woman. He submits that it cannot be said that the respondent police are not taking interest or there is no proper investigation. The respondent police are conducting impartial investigation to trace out the missing woman.

4. Tak ng into consideration the submission made by the learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home, this Court finds no reason to direct the police to transfer the case from local police station to CBI or CBCID.

Accordingly, the Writ Petition is dismissed. No order as to costs.

Miscellaneous applications, pending if any, shall stand closed.
