Mr. R. Gurung, learned GA is present on behalf of the State-respondent No.1.

The case record reveals that the present matter was initially listed for motion on 12-09-2023 when none appeared for the petitioner and the matter was ordered to be listed after two weeks.

On 28-09-2023, the petitioner's Counsel appeared and after hearing him notice was issued to the respondent whereupon it was ordered that petitioner shall take steps for service of notice upon the respondent No.2 within two days, however, the petitioner failed to take any steps for service of notice upon the respondent No.2.

On 18-10-2023 when the matter was listed before this Court again nobody appeared for the petitioner and the matter was adjourned for two weeks. By the same order, it was reiterated that petitioner shall take steps for service of notice upon the respondent No.2 within two days. It seems

thereafter also petitioner failed to take any steps for service of notice upon the respondent No.2.

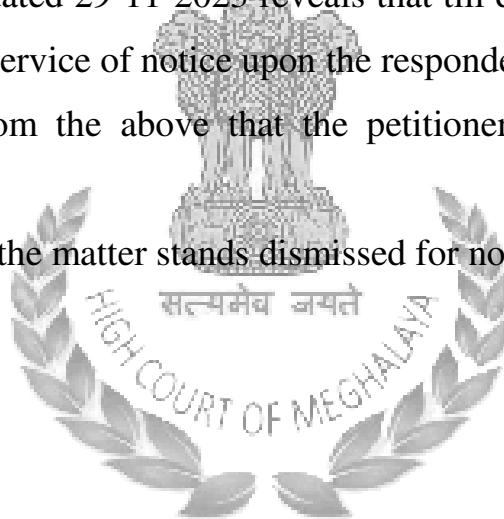
On 14-11-2023 when the matter was taken up, Mr. P. K. Garodia, learned counsel for the petitioner appeared before this Court and submitted that due to some difficulty, steps for service of notice could not be taken and prayed for grant of some more time. The prayer of the petitioner was allowed and the petitioner was granted 24 hours' time to take steps for service of notice upon the respondent No.2.

Today also when the matter was called out none appeared for the petitioner.

Office-Note dated 29-11-2023 reveals that till date petitioner has not taken any steps for service of notice upon the respondent No.2.

It appears from the above that the petitioner is not interested in pursuing the matter.

Accordingly, the matter stands dismissed for non-prosecution.
