**Hon'ble Shri Justice Deepak Kumar Tiwari****Order on Board****30.06.2023**

1. This is the 1<sup>st</sup> bail application filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail to the Applicant, who has been arrested in connection with Crime No.94/2023 registered at P.S Gandai, District Khairagarh-Chuikhadan-Gandai (CG) for the offence under Section 420/34 IPC.

2. Prosecution case is that the Complainant lodged a report stating that during the period between 2016 and 2021, he sold paddy to the Applicant and there was a due of amount to the tune of Rs.10,03,600/- on the part of the Applicant, which has not yet been paid by him, therefore, the offence as aforesaid has been registered against him.

3. Learned counsel for the Applicant submits that the Applicant is innocent and has been falsely implicated in the crime in question for which, he is languishing in jail since 01.05.2023, he is a reputed business man involved in purchase of paddy, there was a dispute of monetary transaction between the period 2016-2021 with the Complainant, FIR has been lodged belatedly, investigation has been completed and charge sheet has been filed and conclusion of trial is likely to take quite some time, therefore, considering all these aspects, he may be released on bail.

4. On the other hand, learned State Counsel opposed the bail application.

5. Having heard learned counsel for the parties, having regard to the facts and circumstances of the case, considering the nature of accusation and the dispute of monetary transaction, without further commenting anything on merits, I am inclined to allow the application.

6. Accordingly, the application is **allowed** and it is directed that on Applicant's furnishing a personal bond for a sum of Rs.25,000/- with one surety in the like sum to the satisfaction of the concerned Court, he shall be released on bail. He shall however, make his appearance before the concerned Court as and when so directed.
