- 2. Prima-facie, the issue raised in this petition is no longer res-integra in view of the authoritative pronouncement by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No.2471 of 2023 @ SLP (C) No.6185/2020, titled as The Director (Admn. And HR) KPTCL & Ors. Versus C.P. Mundinamani & Ors., decided on April 11, 2023, where the Hon'ble Supreme Court has unequivocally held that the Government employees cannot be denied the annual increment merely because they are to retire on the very next day of earning the increment and on the contrary the view as taken by this Court in CWP No.2503 of 2016, titled as Hari Prakash Versus State of Himachal Pradesh and Ors., decided on 06.11.2020 as also the view taken by various High Courts has not been approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court.
- 3. Therefore, in such circumstances, the present petition is disposed of by directing the respondents to treat the instant petition as a representation on behalf of the petitioner and thereafter consider and decide the case of the petitioner in light of the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Civil Appeal No.2471 of 2023 @ SLP (C) No.6185/2020* (supra) within a period of eight weeks from today.

4. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
