It is further alleged that permissible limit for extracting mines and minerals is up to 10 ft, but private respondents have dug their agricultural fields up to 20 ft, which is against public interest and therefore this writ petition has been filed in public interest.</p> <p>(3) Learned State Counsel, on instructions, submits that respondent no. 18 has been granted permission to remove riverbed materials from his agricultural field in order to make the agricultural field cultivable. Learned Counsel for the petitioners, however, disputes this contention, based on the document received by petitioners under Right to Information Act.</p> <p>(4) Learned Counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioners have made representation to District</p>
