The present contempt petition has been filed for initiation
of contempt proceeding as against the opposite party no. 2
alleging willful violation of order dated 16.08.2023 passed in
W.P.(S) No. 3649 of 2023.

2. Mr. Aditya Kumar, A.C. to Mr. Ashok Kumar Yadav, learned
Standing Counsel (JUVNL) appearing on behalf of the opposite
party no. 2, refers to paragraph-6 of the show cause affidavit filed
on behalf of the said opposite party, which reads as under:

"6. That it is most humbly and respectfully submitted
that in compliance of order dated 16.08.2023 passed in
W.P.(S) No. 3649 of 2023 by this Hon'ble Court, the
answering respondent has passed as reasoned order
issued vide letter no. 1213 dated 21.09.2024, pursuant
to which the petitioner has been found to be entitled for
payment of the following benefits and the same has
been credited to the account of the petitioner vide
Cheque No. 323613 dated 20.09.2024.

a. Leave Encashment	Rs.8,877/-	Cheque no. 323613 dated 20.09.2024
b. Revised pay	Rs.14,975/-	
c. Revised pension	Rs.1,25,242/-	
d. Revised Gratuity	Rs.15,213/-	
Total	Rs.1,64,307/-	

"Copy of letter no. 1213 dated 21.09.2024 along with payment details have been annexed as Annexure-A series to the said show cause affidavit."

3. It is thus submitted that the aforesaid order of this Court has been complied.

4. Having heard learned counsel for the parties and on perusal of the show cause affidavit filed on behalf of the opposite party no. 2, there is no need to further proceed in the present matter.

5. The contempt proceeding as against the opposite party no.2 is hereby dropped.

6. The contempt petition is accordingly disposed of.

7. The petitioner is, however, at liberty to take appropriate recourse as permissible under law for redressal of her subsisting grievance.
