ORAL ORDER

By way of present petition, the petitioner has sought a direction to the respondent authority to register the complaint as per the representations dated 24.02.2025 and 26.02.2025 at Annexure-A Colly to the petition.

Perusing the record, it *prima facie* appears that representations at Annexure-A Colly does not disclose any cognizable offence and hence, no direction in exercise of power under Article 226 of the Constitution of India can be issued in present petition and petition is accordingly dismissed as alternative remedy is available. However, it is kept open for the petitioner to take appropriate recourse under Section 156(3) of the CrPC [section 173(3) of the BNSS], if any cognizable offence is committed. It is made clear that this Court has not gone into the merits of the case.
