Learned State counsel as well as counsel for the complainant vehemently opposed the anticipatory bail application on the ground that the serious and heinous allegations have been levelled by the complainant/victim in the F.I.R., therefore, the applicant/accused is not entitled to get this relief at this stage.</p> <p>6. They would further submit that an equally efficacious remedy is available to the applicant/accused to file the anticipatory bail application before the Sessions Court but without exhausting the same, the applicant/accused has straightaway approached this Court for getting the anticipatory bail.</p> <p>7. In view of the above, the anticipatory bail application is hereby dismissed.
