The 3<sup>rd</sup> bail application has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C./483 B.N.S.S. on behalf of accused-petitioner in the matter arising out of F.I.R. No.446/2023 registered at Police Station Mansarovar Jaipur City (South) for the offence(s) punishable under Section(s) 307, 341, 323, 324, 326 & 120-B I.P.C. and under Section 4/25 of Arms Act.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the case, he has nothing to do with the alleged offence and he is behind the bars since 14.05.2023. Counsel further submits that the statement(s) of medical expert & injured, namely Aakash have already been recorded before the learned Court below. Trial of the case is likely to take a long time to conclude. Till then his further incarceration would not serve any

fruitful purpose and he is ready and willing to furnish his bail bonds. Therefore, the 3<sup>rd</sup> bail application deserves to be allowed.

Learned Public Prosecutor has vehemently opposed the bail application.

Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the material made available on record.

Taking into consideration the submissions put forth and overall facts & circumstances of the case but without commenting upon detailed merits of the case, this Court deems it fit to enlarge the accused-petitioner on bail.

Therefore, the 3<sup>rd</sup> bail application is **allowed**. The accused-petitioner, namely **Jitendra Choudhary @ Jeetu S/o Shri Jagveer Singh**, shall be released on bail, if he is not required in any other case, provided he furnishes a personal bond in the sum of Rs.50,000/- (Fifty Thousand) together with two sureties in the sum of Rs.25,000/- (Twenty-five Thousand) each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court with the stipulation that he shall appear before that Court and any other court to which the matter is transferred, on all subsequent dates of hearing and as and when he is called upon to do so.
